1 MS. GANSLE: This public hearing is being held
2 by order of the Town Board pursuant to Section 202-b of
3 the Town Law of the State of New York in relation to the
4 proposed pipe bridge evaluation project.

5 Notice of the public hearing has been
6 published in the official Town newspaper which is the
7 Spotlight and has been posted in the Town Clerk's
8 bulletin board. I have an affidavit for each.

9 The Town Board will now hear all persons
10 interested in this project.

11 MS. PECK: The project before the Board tonight
12 relates to the pipe bridge evaluation project. The
13 Division of Pure Waters owns and operates five sanitary
14 sewer bridges throughout the Town. Recently, inspections
15 were conducted to evaluate the structural integrity of
16 each pipe bridge. Certain repairs and preemptive
17 measures were identified for each pipe and have been
18 detailed in the engineering report prepared by Greenman
19 Pedersen, which is on file with the Town Clerk's office.
20 Those recommendations are also itemized in the
21 Resolution that is before the Town Board tonight.

22 The maximum amount to complete the
23 recommended repairs and preemptive measures is
24 \$1,759,000. It is estimated that the project will be
25 bonded over a 30-year timeframe and it would result in

1 an increase of \$2.45 in the annual sewer charges
2 assessed against a typical single-family residential
3 home. I would be happy to answer any questions that
4 the board or public may have.

5 SUPERVISOR MAHAN: Any further questions from
6 the Board?

10 We will close a public hearing.

11 Thank you, Crystal.
