## **THE COLONIE YOUTH COURT**

### **“Citizenship for Today and Tomorrow”**

The Colonie Youth Court was incorporated as Youth Courts of the Capital District, Inc. on December 13, 1993. Prior thereto, a community group of 40 adults began work to develop this demonstration Youth Court. Committees were formed to address issues of Training and Program Development, Constitution and By-laws, Community Service Program, Employee Identification, Finance, Community Relations, Referrals, Ceremonies, Program Identification and Recruitment.

From the initial advisory committee organizational meeting in May 1993 until the first training class for student members of Youth Court on September 27, 1994, members of the community have mobilized and seen their combined efforts come to fruition. During this time much was accomplished including a not-for-profit corporation was established, a curriculum and training manual, a community service program, policies and procedures, office space and court room space were made available, proposals and grants were submitted, an employee was hired, services to be provided were finalized, brochures were written and printed, a Youth Court logo was designed and goals, objectives, and performance measures were identified.

On October 13, 1994 an advisory board of the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services awarded a \$45,000 demonstration grant from the United States Department of Justice-Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention to fund the Colonie Youth Court. The Capital District Regional Planning Commission, which was the coordinating agency for this grant, voted to act as the grantee on behalf of the Colonie Youth Court. Along with the other startup grants from the New York Bar Foundation, Albany County Bar Foundation, and substantial in-kind support from the United States Attorney’s Office for the Northern District of New York, Town of Colonie Police Department, and the Town of Colonie Justice Department, enabled Colonie Youth Court to become operational.

On December 8, 1994 the first Colonie Youth Court Ceremony honored 75 high school students from Colonie Central High School and Shaker High School for their completion of the course of instruction and induction as members of the Colonie Youth Court. On January 19, 1995, Colonie Youth Court heard its first case. During its first year, Colonie Youth Court heard almost 100 young offender cases referred from the Colonie Police Department, Colonie Justice Department, and the Albany County Probation Department. To date, the Colonie Youth Court has heard over 1,500 young offender cases. The court currently has 100 student members and approximately 250 registered jurors. Over 925 youth have become members of the Colonie Youth Court. The program has a 98.5% successful completion rate among offenders.

The community service program provides a wide range of educational classes and community service work projects. In addition, each offender serves as a juror on a subsequent case as the final component in completion of their peer imposed sentence, allowing for positive participation in the criminal justice system. Volunteerism among youth and adults has been substantially promoted through the establishment of the Colonie Youth Court.

On April 26, 2004, the Town of Colonie acquired our Youth Court program. It operates under the Colonie Police Department under the direction of the Chief of Police. The Colonie Youth Court has been and will continue to be one of the special achievements for which the Town of Colonie is highly regarded.

Letter of apology to the Police Officer or the store where the merchandise was stolen, or the high school principal, help Emergency Medical Services, attend a substance abuse evaluation class, take drug tests, write an essay on how your actions affected another person, curfews, enroll in substance abuse prevention program at Hope House, attend a resisting peer pressure class, attend a shoplifting prevention class, apologize to your parents, attend counseling sessions, restitution to the victim, write 300 word letter of apology to the victim, pay for gas expenses for parents driving you to community service, take a gun safety precaution class, obtain working papers, find employment, etc.
