StateWide's Medicare Corner

Medicare Open Enrollment Scams

"Watch out for scams during the Medicare Open Enrollment Period as you look for your best health coverage options, don't forget to keep an eye open for fraudsters! **Open Enrollment** can quickly become an "**Open Season**" for scammers," announced Maria Alvarez, Executive Director of

StateWide.

Medicare Open Enrollment is an annual period during which Medicare beneficiaries can make changes to their health and prescription drug plans. It's an opportunity to review and adjust your coverage to ensure it aligns with your healthcare needs and budget. This period typically runs from October 15th to December 7th, with any changes made taking effect on January 1st of the following year.

Alvarez advises seniors to beware of these typical Medicare Enrollment Scams:

- Watch out for people who: Claim they work with or represent Medicare, are an "official Medicare agent".
- There are no Medicare representatives and Medicare will never cold-call you.
- Say you must join a Medicare prescription plan (also known as Part D). It is voluntary to join a Medicare prescription drug plan.
- Ask for personal information, such as your Medicare number, Social Security number and/or bank information.
- Threaten or pressure you to enroll in their plan. You will not lose your benefits and have the entire Open Enrollment Period to decide on a plan.
- Offer you gifts to enroll in their plan -- it's illegal.

If you suspect your Medicare or SS number has been compromised, think you've been enrolled in a plan without your permission, or if you have any questions about Medicare fraud and what coverage is best for your needs, reach out to StateWide's certified counselors today.



Celebrate a Senior Spotlight

Bruce Mendini grew up in northern Michigan. He was the third of ten children born to his German Swedish mother and Austrian father. In 1964, Bruce and two of his brothers were drafted to serve for our country in Vietnam. Bruce served in the United States Air Force from 1964 until 1968. He was stationed in Texas, Colorado, Florida, Arizona and Okinawa. He worked in the maintenance of missile guidance systems, requiring top-secret clearance. He attained the rank of Sergeant when he was discharged. After serving in our US Air Force, Bruce obtained a position with UNIVAC (Universal Numeric Integrating Automatic Calculator), and was sent to Ilion, NY to train for his career. This is where he was invited on a blind, double date where he was introduced to a young teacher named, Jackie. They enjoyed a jazz combo with Gap Mangione and talked until the sun came up. One year later, Bruce and Jackie were married.

Bruce and Jackie raised their three children in the Town of Colonie: Ellen, Kathy and David. Bruce's position with UNIVAC involved being on-call 24/7 during his 15 years with them. During retirement years, both Bruce and Jackie have enjoyed their memberships with the Thunder Road Senior Club. They are the proud grandparents of seven grandchildren, ranging in age from 5 to 24 years.

In 2019, Sergeant Mendini was honored as "Veteran of the Day" at a patriotic ceremony which took place at Disney World! After assisting in lowering the American flag, Bruce proudly carried it down Main Street. Bruce paid the honor forward by serving as President of Capital District Patriot Flight, Inc. He had taken the trip with a friend years before and was impressed by the number of volunteers, dedication, and donations put forth to make it happen. Bruce is still a supporter of the organization today, informing and encouraging others to learn more about the wonderful service they offer to our Veterans.

Patriot Flight is the official representative of the *National Honor Flight Network* for seven counties in the Capital District. They are a nonprofit 501 (C3) corporation that is run fully by volunteers who operate under *Patriot Flight, Inc.* Their mission is to enable all US Veterans to visit the memorials in Washington DC which are dedicated in their honor. The day commences at 6:00 am (06:00) and concludes at about 10:30 pm (22:30). Although this may sound like a long day, there are no sleepers on the way home! Veterans who served our country at different times share their stories with one another throughout their day and night.

Patriot Flight staff and volunteers play a large role in this whole experience: seeing the group off complete with speakers and Color Guard ceremony, and then greeting them again at the Albany airport upon their return. Professional photographers travel with the group throughout the day, providing with an 8x10 framed group photo for every Veteran, and posting photos for their families on Facebook. Each Veteran also receives a Mission booklet encompassing their trip and listing the sponsors who made it possible.
